Easter Promise

Easter is a promise that God gave to you, a promise of eternal life, a season of renewal. As the scent of roses fills the air, and blue jays sweetly sing, remember that God is with you and guiding you this spring. For he vowed that he will always be there, to wrap you in his arms when you need his care. He has faith in you, and his heart shall ever be true, no matter what you way or do. Even should you stumble or fall, God will lead you a hand to help you stand tall.







Dear Members and Friends of First Parish.

I mentioned in my remarks to you this past Sunday that I have been with you for three months. And I also noted that one of you commented that "the rust" had been scraped away (I do hope you are right!). And, again, from my initial skepticism about functioning as your pastor under the rules of the 'new normal,' I have settled into my life with you joyfully. But I have quipped, half amusingly, that I wonder what it will be like to preach from the pulpit each Sunday after being able to say "cut" to Amy whenever I trip over my tongue or lose my way or someone's phone rings, etc. We'll see how it feels to come back to 'normal'.

We are going to pass through the season of Lent, beginning with Ash Wednesday and forty days later, Easter to mark the resurrection. This forty day period replicates Jesus withdrawing into the desert for 40 days to fast and prepare himself before beginning his public teaching.

The number 40 is mentioned 146 times in Scripture. Here are a few examples:

- -Moses spent 40 days on Mt. Sinai twice; Exodus 24 and 34
- -Elijah spent 40 days traveling to Mt. Horeb; 1 Kings
- -God sent 40 days and nights of rain in the Great Flood of Noah; Genesis 7
- -The Hebrews wandered in the desert 40 years while traveling to the Promised Land; Numbers 14
- -Jonah's prophecy of judgment gave Ninevah 40 days to repent or be destroyed; Jonah 3

The 40 day/year number is seen as a time of testing, trial or probation.

The word 'lent' comes from an Old English word meaning 'spring season' as it culminates with Easter, a spring rite itself. For centuries, Christians have marked this period with fasting (no meat for some), deep reflection and repentance. The customs and traditions of the 'high churches' are not those of Congregationalists historically; but we generally agree to a dedicated time in our church year when we do turn inward and reflect on our lives - take some spiritual inventory. I chuckle remembering as young Roman Catholic asking each other "what are you giving up for Lent?" Some would say chewing gum (I was never big on gum); some would say candy; we all had to abstain from meat on Friday (good for the local fishermen). And some would 'add' as well as 'give up'. Go to mass, confession and receive communion each week. I served mass every day during Lent - the youngest altar boy in my church at 8 years old. I would get up at 6 and walk a half mile to church for the 7 am mass. Walk back home, make my lunch and walk another half mile to school. Lent was a very serious time for me.

I do not think we need to make the Lenten time a sacrificial time, but I am warm to the idea of using these 6 weeks or so to be more introspective - take a close look at who we are. I have not become the 'perfect person' I had hoped to become after a few decades of experience. Maybe there is still a little rust here and there, waiting to be scraped off. Let's all go to the BODY SHOP together in these next 40 days.

Let us look to the day when we are all vaccinated and can worship, sing, pray and LISTEN TO HIS VOICE together.

Join us for Maundy Thursday & Easter Services



Maundy-Thursday service-will be observed on April 1st, 2021 at 4:30 pm Easter Service- will be celebrated on Sunday, April 4th, 2021 at 10:00am

Both services will be in our church Sanctuary and on Facebook and YouTube. We will need to follow the CDC guidelines of wearing masks, and social distancing must be observed. If you are interested in attending either service in the church, please contact Nancie Cameron at bballmom824@yahoo.com or 603-781-5302 and let her know which ones you will be attending.

This is what you can expect when you come to church:

- * All people entering the church MUST wear a mask. If you are sick, please stay home.
- * Upon entering the church, you will have your temperature taken with a no touch thermometer, you will be asked the typical Covid questions, extra masks will be available and you will be asked to use the hand sanitizer available.
- * You will be escorted to your seat as soon as you enter the church conversations in the Narthex will be discouraged. We will be seating people from front to back, depending on when you arrive. If you have a disability that requires you to be seated in a specific area, please let Nancie Cameron know when you contact her. We ask that you not leave your seat to visit with others. Every other pew will be blocked off for spacing.
- * A bulletin will be placed on your seat earlier in the week. Please take it home with you no recycling available in the church.
- * There will be no singing during the worship service. The hymnals and bibles will be temporarily removed.
- * We will have to wait for a safer time to include "passing the peace".
- * An offering plate will be placed in the back of the sanctuary or in the narthex for you to place offering envelopes as you leave.
- * Though Thomas and Annette would love to talk with each of you personally, this is not a safe time to do so. For this reason, they will remain in their seats until everyone has left.
- * At the end of the service, you will be escorted out of the church from the back row to the front. Please remember to leave at least 6 feet between you and the person in front of you.
- * The upstairs bathrooms are available for use. Disinfectant wipes and hand sanitizer will be available in or near the bathrooms for your use. Please use the wipes to clean surfaces you touch before and after use (including door knobs).
- * Communion is strongly discouraged by the state and the insurance board, so we will wait until it is safe participate in it.
- * If, at any time, the state tells us we cannot worship in the church, we will contact you by email or phone and will resume services on Facebook and YouTube only.
