Thanksgiving, here in New Hampshire, sounds like real places and people. We notice hot coffee after worship when the cold clings to our coats. We notice the quiet saints who stack chairs in the fellowship hall, the crossing guards in the morning chill, the road crews out before dawn, the volunteers at the food pantry. We notice creation preaching its own sermon: rime on the pasture fence, the hush on the trail up Monadnock, the clean line of mountains to the north. Gratitude opens our eyes to the God already at work in small towns and city blocks from the Seacoast to the Connecticut River.

Psalm 100 also roots our thanks in God's character: "For the Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever." Enduring love doesn't deny grief or the needs we see around us; it holds us while we tell the truth. As a United Church of Christ congregation in the Granite State, our thanksgiving spills outward—into casseroles delivered, fuel vouchers shared, rides to appointments, and hands extended after the first snow. We give thanks by mending what is torn and standing with neighbors who feel forgotten.

So let's practice thanksgiving on purpose this month. Begin the day with one small thanks before your feet touch the chilly floor. Name a blessing at supper—even on hockey-practice nights. Offer a word of appreciation to someone whose work is usually unseen. And when worry rises, step back through the psalm's doorway: "Enter...with thanksgiving." The God who formed our hills and lakes is still good. The love that held our ancestors holds us now. Thanks be to God.
