As October colors climb the Whites and the first frosts silver our fields, New Hampshire settles into peak-fall rhythms—orchards busy, church suppers warm, woodpiles stacked along old stone walls. The psalmist prays, "Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a wise heart" (Psalm 90:12). Wisdom in this season looks like steady purpose rather than hurry: thoughtful planning, generous sowing, and trust that God "crowns the year with...bounty" (Psalm 65:11)—in a good apple harvest, a neighbor's help with the splitter, or a sanctuary full of song.

Not every turn is easy; some carry grief or uncertainty into this bright month. For you, hear the promise: "My help comes from the Lord," who keeps our "going out and coming in" on back roads and busy routes alike (Psalm 121:2, 8). So let's practice small stillnesses—on a leaf-lined trail, at the communion table, over coffee after worship—"Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10). And with grateful hearts, let us say, "This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it" (Psalm 118:24).
